*Two or three semesters of 5 courses will be needed if students are to complete the BS degree in 4 years. Two or three courses in summer school would alleviate the need for 5 courses/semester. Students must have a GPA of 3.3 or higher to enroll in 5 courses.

**Graduate course which does NOT count toward the BS degree. May only be taken by students with senior status and a GPA of 3.0 or higher. Students must have 32 units of undergraduate coursework to receive their bachelor's degree.

Before the start of the fall term of senior year, students will be formally admitted to the teacherpreparation part of the program if they have met the following criteria:

- a minimum of 22 earned course units

- a grade of B- or higher in RAL 220 and satisfactory or higher disposition ratings

- a minimum GPA of 3.0 or higher

- Passing scores (as set by the State of New Jersey) on the SAT, ACT, or Praxis Core. Students are required to provide evidence of passing scores before receiving formal admission into the program.
